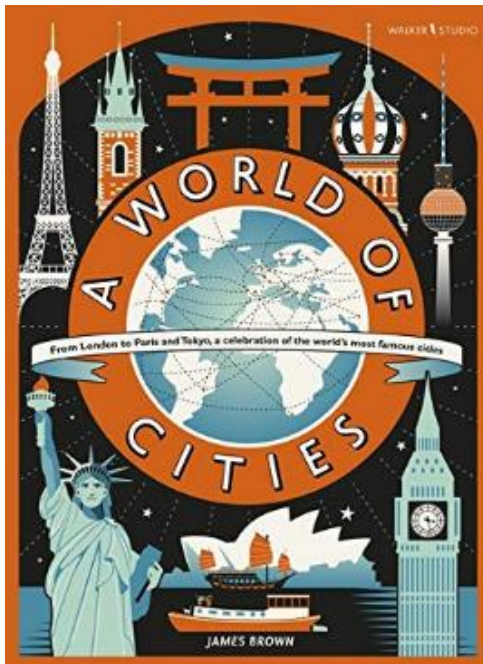


Monday 4th May - reading challenge

Paris was founded in the third century BCE by a Celtic people called the Parisii, who gave the city its name.

Paris is referred to as the "City of Light" after its famous Enlightenment thinkers, such as Voltaire and Rousseau.
