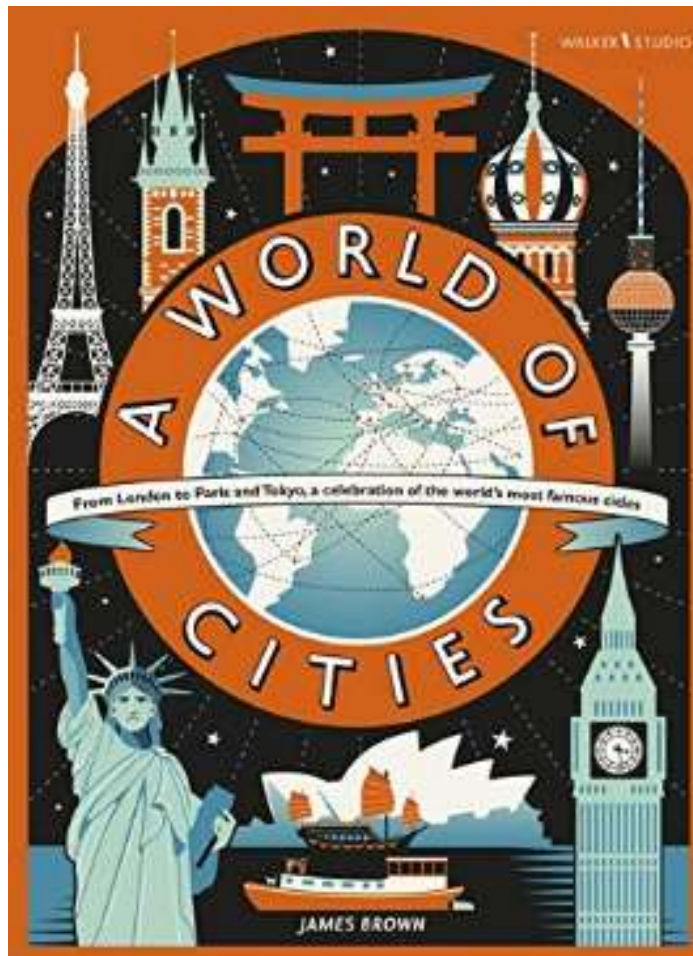


Friday 1<sup>st</sup> May - reading challenge

Your task is to **create ten fact finding questions** for the rest of the class to answer next week, based on the information on Paris on the next page.

**For example**, in the text it says at the bottom, "Paris is home to world-famous fashion houses, including Chanel and Dior."

I can turn this into a question – *What are the names of two fashion houses in Paris?*

It's a *fact finding* question, because you must *find* information in the text.

Send your ten questions to me and I'll choose some of them for you to all answer next week.

Perched on top of the steep hill of Montmartre, Basilique du Sacré-Coeur is the highest point in Paris at 130 m above sea level.

The River Seine flows through Paris from the southeast to the southwest.
