


Tuesday 9th June – Reading

For today's Reading task, we will be continuing to look at the video that we watched yesterday, 'The Small Shoemaker'. Watch the video again to familiarise yourself with the key events (<https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=DvgRn8STjmQ>).

You are going to consider how Mr Botte's feelings change across the story and plot them onto a feelings graph. Use the clues in the video such as body language and facial expressions to help you infer how he is feeling. When you have plotted all of the points, you will connect them. Also, we'd like you to label each point with an adjective to describe how Mr Botte is feeling. You'll need to think about choosing your adjectives carefully because some feelings are more positive than others. Try to complete the feelings graph without using the same adjective twice.

Here's an example of a feelings graph for Wolf from the 'Three Little Pigs' tale. On the next page, you'll find the feelings graph for Mr Botte with the key events marked out.

A lady stops to look at a pair of Mr Botte's shoes.
